During that conference the book was outlined in chapters, information was filed, and the Twelve Steps Of N.A. were put together.

GOALS FOR THIS CONFERENCE

1. Complete final draft of the Narcotics Anonymous Big Book.
2. Submit literature to the World Service Conference in Sun Valley, Calif. two months prior to May first.

Members were called on to discuss why we are here and what we hope to accomplish. We hope to help the practicing drug addict. We do not need to feel comfortable with failure any more; we can succeed in life. We are not alone. There is strength in numbers. We can have pride in our recovery. We are free, clean & sober because of this design for living. We are here because God wants us to be here. Meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Mollie P. turned meeting over to Bo S.-Atlanta Ga. Asks members
to call one person in home area to accept long distance calls, and to
call home group every day to keep the home groups informed of how the
conference is working and what is being accomplished. Ask home groups
for contributions to help cover the cost of supplies such as envelope
paper, money to buy coffee. Ask home groups to continue to send stories
and to give any feed-back as to how the conference is going.

The main objective of this Literature Conference is to get our

N.A. Big Book done this year.

N.A. is basically the same in all the areas of the world, thus making it possible for the group here to go over the material, to arrange it, edit it, review and revise it, and still have representation from a vast majority of N.A. members. After the chapters are in draft form, a copy will be sent to every meeting in the world, with a Review form attached, so all members of N.A. can give feed-back and input to the actual Big Book. These forms will have to be sent back to the World Literature office, located in Marietta, Ga. The material needs to be consistent, from our experience in N.A.

Need to make a decision as to work on one chapter at a time as a group conscience, or to split the chapters between groups.

Hank F.-Atlanta Ga. makes motion to work on the chapters one at a time as a group conscience.

Linda M.-Topeka Kansas would like to split into groups of 4 to 5 and work on separate chapters.

Page C.-Marietta Ga. states there are not enough people to split into groups to work on individual chapters, and there are too many people to work on one chapter together, suggests to split into 2 or 3 groups and work on a chapter in each group.

Dwayne L.-Ft. Lauderdale Flor. suggest possibility of repetition, if we split into groups, on separate chapters. Bo S.-Marietta Ga. suggests to split into groups and work on different parts of one chapter, and to have a group conscience after each group finishes their part of the chapter, thus making it possible to review each chapter in succession. Break into small groups for discussion.

Page C.-Marietta Ga. makes motion to vote on doing one chapter at a time, to be in groups working on different parts of the same chapter.

Tom M.-Marietta Ga. seconds the motion. Members vote unanimously to Work on one chapter at a time, and to have group conscience on the chapter

as needed.

Jim M.-Leetonia, Oh. mentions need to remove redundancy from the book. i.e. If we are Clean, we are sober, If we are addicts, we are alcoholics. Therefore, let us keep our identities and our book simple, and understandable. To say we are addicts, and are clean is all we need to say. It is redundant and confusing to say we are clean and sober, addicts, and alcoholics.

Bo S. reminds us to seek stories. Call home and ask N.A. members to send their stories. There is a need for a release form to be signed by anyone, if their story is used. This will prevent hard-feelings and possible court involvement, because any misunderstandings. There is also a need to go through the files and find out how many stories we have at this time. These stories will need to be read, and filed. Tom M. and Dwayne L. will be responsible for getting information out of the files and into the files.

We need a supply list kept up for any materials needed, and a petty cash fund to be kept for these supplies. Tom M. will handle this.

Jim M. brings up topic of a style sheet. We will write a style sheet and give a copy to all members.

We need to set daily goals as to how much has to be done in one day, and no matter how long it takes us to finish this goal, it will be completed before work is finished for the day. Bo S. will work on an agenda to be followed.

Bo S. states that the second, third, and fifth chapters of
Big Book were done at the Second World Conference held in Lincoln
Nebraska, and are in their third draft and ready to be reviewed
by the group conscience. Members are asked to take a copy and to
review it as we reviewed Chapter one. Members are also asked to
turn their attention to the typing, clipping and pasting of chapters
next.

George R. states he would like to have chapter four split
into two chapters, those being A) How it works and B) The Steps.
George R. and Page C. have reviewed the steps up to step ten.

Gina H. makes motion to review chapter one as a group
conscience beginning tomorrow morning, Linda M. seconds the motion.
Unanimous vote to review chapter one tomorrow morning. Also members
will start reviewing chapters two and three in morning.

As far as stories are Tom M. reports that there are six
stories that have been reviewed and ready for group conscience.

Hank F. and Jim M. placed calls to several areas asking for
support. San Francisco reports they have sent chapter seven via
jet and it should arrive here any time. They have also sent \$250.00
to help support this conference. Greg in Wolf Creek Oregon reports
work is still being done on the Traditions, and their revised
copy will be here as soon as possible. Bill B. in Alabama is sending
his story and a contribution. Jim N. in Lincoln unable to attend
this conference, but is sending other members to represent Lincoln.
There will also be people here to represent Idaho. People in
Jackson Miss., Southern Ala., Pennsylvania, and Idaho are registered
and are expected to be at this conference at some time.

Bo brings to the group that Tom M. should receive any list for needed supplies. Tom will supply all supplies. It was decided that folders containing the day's minutes would be a necessity. Most important result of this conference will be to produce a review copy of the Narcotics Anonymous Book and send it to the World Service Conference in Sun Valley, California. God shall help us to produce this miracle.

Cathy T. stated that Chapter 1 had no continuity and still contained a lot of redundant material. An intensive review workshop for Chapter 1 was suggested.

George is working on Chapter 4. Lincoln, Nebraska has done work on Steps 1 - 10 and sent them here. Wichita, Kansas is sending in their work on Steps 6 - 12. He wants Chapter 4 to be split into two parts: 1) How it works 2) Steps. Page suggested that the two parts become two chapters, following one another, because their content was so broad, yet so vitally important to be close together. Dwayne made a motion that this not be done until more work was received from out of town.

Bo asked how the work on the stories was going. Tom said we have one long story complete and ready for publishing. He suggested that copies of other stories be made and passed around for review. Mollie said we need more stories about women. She also brought to our attention that stories should focus less on the actual drug use and more on recovery.

It is brought to our attention that there is a great need for the style sheet for working on Chapter 1. Hank motions for an update on the style sheet. The motion is seconded by Dwayne.

Terica motioned that the phrases "on program" and "in fellowship" be stricken from the style sheet. The motion was seconded Shorty and was passed. Mollie suggested that phrases for the style sheet contain action words (living, working, using, etc. ...)

rather than words such as in, or on, or other words of like passivity. Tom suggested that "living the program" or "working the program" would sound more appropriate. Mollie agreed. It is agreed to that the following phrases be added to the style sheet: PROGRAM - to mean the Spiritual Principle and FELLOWSHIP - to refer to the N.A. body.

Tom said that the files will be kept up by Cathy, Dwayne, and himself. All other people should ask their help when needing information from the files.

Cathy would like people to leave all pens, pencils, and paper here so that they will not be lost. These items do cost and are easily lost, so please keep up with them if at all possible.

Jim states that we are all learning more and more about keeping a continuous flow in our work. He discusses the spiritual adventure of our work and its importance.

Nolan states that we are learning about the differences in each other's attitudes while working together. We are learning what we are all looking for and what exactly this conference is about.

George says that we have the paste-ups from Lincoln and have made copies. We are working on sections and have section C and section D done. Gina feels that this draft is in very rough paste-up form and needs a lot of work. It needs to be put into we-book-form. We should all ask God for guidance, strength, and direction, and have the courage to change the things that we can.

We have received two letters and two telegrams wishing us luck with our work. Photo-copies will be affixed to today's minutes.

Linda suggests we type pages as they are edited. Another suggestion is that the new people get with the more experienced editors to better understand what is being done and to be of the most value to our work.

Bo feels there is a need for four workshops: typing, reading (and reviewing), writing, and cutting & pasting. People are asked to be of service where they are most talented. The various workshop members are decided and informed. We are all ready to get to work, finally.

Newcomers were encouraged to write and donate their stories.

Work goes on throughout the night, steadily, and we are finally working on a round-the-clock schedule. Progress at the conference will not stand still, ever. Unity is becoming stronger daily and so are our spiritual relationships. God is granting us strength.

Meeting opened by the Serenity Prayer, preceded by a moment of silence. Bo S. began the meeting by stating that the work was going well but must be kept up in order to achieve our final goal. He stressed the importance of keeping the minutes of the day. Round of applause given for the minutes.

Dwayne states that Chapter 1 is back to another editing stage. He feels re-pasting Chapter 1 is unnecessary.

Bo felt we needed to put a hard drive into working Chapters 3 & 4 today. He stressed importance of working on 3 - 10 as soon as possible in order that we may have a solid draft to work with. It is suggested that we use the third floor of this building for silence and peaceful individual care. We then went around the room with suggestions and comments:

Lori I. feels we can do it and will make it.

Frank I. feels he is more a part of the conference today.

Jeff K. feels glad to be here.

Robert feels very excited and fortunate to be here.

Randy is glad to be a part of the conference and can hardly believe this is really happening.

Terica would like to thank the Memphis House people for their help and support.

Gina H. is anxious to see this work and all come together.

Cordy likes where she is at and feels we must all keep the positive spirit going in order for this to work.

Dwayne would like to see Chapter 2 and hustle in getting its mistakes corrected.

Jeff B. sees a need for us to keep the writing simple and to the point.

Mike P. merely feels confusion at this point.

Page suggests the phrase "clean time" for the style sheet in reference to our period of time without drugs. He would like us to keep our phrases simple.

Richard is working with Chapter 4 and feels all is going well.

Bo says that Chapter 7 has arrived from San Francisco and is ready. We all owe our thanks to Doug of the S.F. group.

Gary says he is grateful to be a part of this and he has learned a lot.

Duane states that he has been here 3 days and is still confused, but is grateful to be here.

Morris S. says he is willing to offer any help that he can.

Joseph suggests that we not use slang words, which mean drug addict, in the book at all.

Deb D. feels good about being here. She says that we can and are doing it.

Linda wants the word "toke" added to the phrase "first fix, pill, or drink". The group voted yes and it shall be added to the style sheet. The phrase now reads "first fix, pill, drink, or toke".

Kathy P. is grateful to be here and feels she is doing well in her work.

Kenny H. is working on Chapter 3 and says it is progressing well. There is an applause for Gene L. for his contributions to the work on Chapter 3.

Nolan agrees with Page on his suggestion to use the phrase "clean time". He also feels that A.A. should be mentioned on page 1 of Chapter 3. Bo suggests our gratitude to A.A. should be mentioned in the introduction of our book. It was decided to bring it to the group later on in the evening.

Nolan also feels there is some work to be done on Chapter 7.

Joseph P. read a letter to the group from Wichita and there is an applause for it. He says there will be a conference held in Los Angeles in May of this year. Joseph read a list of people who had contributed their story and if anyone else would like to please go ahead and write and donate their story. It is asked that we contact the following people in reference to their story: Tommy B. of the Atlanta area, Chuck G. and Chuck S. of the L.A. area, Greg P. of Oregon, Jim N of Nebraska, and Bob B. of California and Jimmy K. of the WSO-both founding fathers of N.A.

Registration forms for the World Service Conference, to be held May 1st - 3rd at Los Angeles Valley College, will be available on the literature table.

2) abstinence

section g in its second draft, sections e, and f are being put in there second draft, sections e, and f are also in thier second draft. All the material for the steps needs to be blended together. Page C. states that the second part of chapter four will be done before the morning is over.

Chapter five is in the file and needs to be read. Chapter six is in Wolf Creek and is going to be sent to us over the phone in the morn. Chapter seven is typed and ready for review, this chapter was sent from San Francisco. Chapter eight is typed and ready for review. Chapter nine needs to be typed, and is in that process now. Chapter ten has been cut and pasted and is ready to be typed and prepared for review. Chapters one and two have recieved workshop approval.

PROGRESS IN MEMPHIS

The fourteen hundred forty service hours put in by Thursday morning cannot account for the great leap in NA literature taking place in Memphis, Tennessee at the Third World Literature Conferance. The fact of our progress seemed to reflect three things. First, that a great deal of groundwork was accomplished at the Witchita and Lincoln Literature Conferances that is only now being evidenced. Second, that a great deal of work has been done since the Lincoln Literature Conferance by individuals and areas, and thier work has been unseen until Memphis. Third, and probably the greatest factor of all, is that a potential for new literature has been built up in the spoken Traditions of Narcotics Anonymous over the last twenty eight years. The observation that members serving at Memphis reach about the same leval of performance after only a few hours at the Conferance can only be explained in that the message lives in the spoken traditions and exists in all areas of our fellowship. The basic message of recovery is being recorded at Memphis and constitutes the material being written.

4:00 P.M. First group conscience of the day began by a moment of silence followed by the Serenity Prayer. A list is passed around the room to sign if you don't have a copy of all the minutes. The secretaries will do their best to see that you get a complete set of them.

Jim M. explains the style sheet for the umpteenth time. The question has arisen about the use of profanity in the book. The Lincoln Conference decided that it was acceptable as long as it was not offensive, i.e. shit, fuck, piss, etc. Common sense while editing is a must. An up-to-date version of the style sheet has been handed out.

Nolan told us all that it has been decided that the Fourth World Literature Conference will be held in Sun Valley, California from April 25th to the beginning of the World Service Conference on May 1, 2, & 3. We addicts will be spending up to ten days in sunny California. The cost of WLC-4 will be \$12.00. The cost of the WSC in May is not known at this time. You can contact the sec. for information at this address: WSC c/o Fawn Fayrote/secretary to WSC '81 13749 Chandler Blvd. Van Nuys, Cal. 91401 Nolan will be putting together a list of decent hotels, motels, and N.A. members to stay with if you plan to be there. His address is on the list of addresses to be inserted in today's minutes. Be sure you have two registration forms ready if you plan to be at both conferences.

Bo read a telegram which we received from Jimmy K. Photocopies will be a part of these minutes. It is suggested that we make calls and send letters to all those who have sent their love and support to us this week.

Joe reported that we have thus far had approx. \$1100 in funds. We still need to hustle other regions, areas, and individual members for money to keep the ball rolling.

Shall we make the first two paragraphs of Chapter Three part of our Introduction? That hot question will be debated in the Introduction workshop later. We merely hope the flow never stops.

There is a call for a one hour tape of this conference's highlights to be made. Our recording whiz kid, Mike P., will put in his best effort to make a copy which really carries the message.

A call for reports on the chapter reveals that eight of the first ten chapters are ready for final typing and approval. Three cheers for us! Chapter Seven needs a bit of transition work and rewriting. Chapter Ten is in final rewrite stage. So far, we have about twenty stories, eight about women and twelve about men. At least four more stories are in the works at this moment.

Group conscious closed with the Lord's Prayer.

A story about today's banquet is in the minutes, but I forgot to mention that we raised over \$400 dollars cash and over \$1700 in pledges to go towards our printing bills. We have to raise a minimum of \$3400 to begin printing, and we must have it by Wednesday, the Eleventh, so that we will be able to meet our deadlines. We must have all review copies of the book printed and mailed before the end of February. We must allow groups across the world at least two months to review their copy before the World Service Conference in May. That is when the final copy will be approved. We expect the Fourth World Literature Conference to be an enjoyable experience. Until that time God is with us.
