#### WE'RE MOVING!

The long-awaited WSO relocation is finally taking place. We signed a lease for our new offices, located in Chatsworth, California, on Monday 16 January and are now busy with planning and preparation.

We haven't yet set a firm date for the actual move, but it probably won't be before the annual meeting of the World Service Conference, traditionally held the final week in April.

We have contracted with a professional project manager to help us so that our move goes as smoothly as possible. The manager heads up a committee, the members of which are drawn from various teams at WSO. The team leaders' assistants have been included as have the safety officer and the shipping manager. The relocation committee is responsible for making decisions on the myriad details that go into relocating an office—everything from deciding whether or not to continue using the same PO box to making arrangements for the orderly transfer of computer, telephone, and other fragile equipment.

Part of the reason we won't be able to move before the beginning of May is that we must make some structural changes to the new building before we move in. The World Service Office has made do with poorly arranged warehouse facilities, inadequate storage, and other inconveniences for a long time. Our new offices will be a great improvement; however, we must do some interior construction to accommodate our specific needs, and in anticipation of our needs for the next few years.

At this writing, we have identified more than one hundred individual tasks, which have been assigned to the members of the relocation committee. Members of the committee are busy fulfilling the tasks assigned them.

We expect that there will be some interruption to services, though we are making every effort to keep this to a minimum. All of our relocation plans are geared to ensuring that we continue to provide the same level of service to the March world services meeting, the annual World Service Conference, and, of course, to the fellowship. Please help us by planning your requests to WSO as far in advance as possible. For instance, if you need information for a regional or area meeting, please try to call as soon as you know you need the information. The same goes for literature orders; please don't wait until you

run out of literature before placing an order because our normal quick turnaround time in filling literature orders may be affected.

#### HOW TO USE THE VOICE-MAIL SYSTEM

We reported in the November *Newsline* that we would soon be going on-line with a voice-mail system, and sure enough, we did. Those of you who have called the World Service Office in recent weeks are aware that we have a few glitches to iron out; however, we think that our goal of returning calls in a more timely manner is being met. We are providing the following guide in order to help you reduce your time listening to voice-mail choices.

The first choice you are given is to proceed in English or Spanish. For English, press 1; for Spanish, press 2. Important note: If you know the extension number for the person with whom you wish to speak, you must first dial 1, then wait until the recording tells you that you can dial the three-digit extension of your party. If you do not have a touch-tone phone, please hold on; the operator will answer. You may also reach the operator at any time during any of the various recordings by pressing 0.

The next level of the voice mail asks you to choose from among four general areas of services provided by WSO. These are: order entry and accounting; fellowship services; world service boards, committees or the world convention; other services. If you are calling to place a literature order, check the status of a literature order or of

your account, or related matters, you would press 3 for order entry and accounting. If you are calling about a group or local service concern, to update your group or trusted servant information, or about translations completed or in progress, you would press 4 for fellowship services. If you are calling to find out about any world service activities—the World Service Conference and its committees, World Service Board of Trustees, dates and registration information for the world convention—press 5. Other services—reached by pressing 6—include fellowship intellectual property, copyright, and trademark information. For instance, if your group wants to photocopy the essay on Tradition Five from the Basic Text and use it during your group's meetings for study purposes, you would choose this extension. Or, if you want to use the NA logo in a creative work that you intend to sell, you would choose this extension. Pressing 6 will also transfer your call to editorial services, including The NA Way Magazine. Important note: If your NA Way hasn't arrived or you want to change your address, you should call our subscriber services number (818) 760-8983. Other editorial questions or concerns are handled at extension 6 as well; for instance, if you want to comment on a Newsline article or ask when the next issue of the Conference Digest will be published, you should press 6.

Once you have chosen the general area of service you want, the recorded message will provide you with a list of specific departments. Please do not hesitate to leave a message on an individual's voice mail box. We will return your call as soon as possible.

We appreciate your patience with our new voice-mail system. We expected that there would be a few start-up problems with this system, and there have been, but we believe that the benefits of this system will far outweigh the minor drawbacks. We all feel confident that the voice-mail system will improve our responsiveness to the fellowship, and we expect that the system will save money because of the overall increase in our efficiency.

If you have any specific suggestions about the voice-mail system, please let us know. Direct your suggestions to the WSO Operations Team. We'd be happy to hear from you.

#### STAFF CHANGES

We are pleased to announce the hiring of two new staff members for the fellowship services team: Oscar Gomez and Elodie Brulere. Both began work 14 November 1994. Both are bilingual. Oscar speaks Spanish and English. Elodie speaks French and English. They have been very helpful in translating correspondence and assisting our French- and Spanish-speaking members. Please join us in welcoming them to the World Service Office.

#### **GROUP REGISTRATIONS**

We're happy to report that both new group registrations and updates have been on the upswing in recent months. We are hoping that this is in response to our "campaign" to get groups registered. We intend to continue our efforts to get our groups registered. We know from talking to some of you that you have taken on the task of helping us in this effort by announcing the importance of group registrations at all the NA meetings and events you attend. We'd like to thank you.

Our experience has shown that registering your group—or yourself as a trusted servant—promotes NA's primary purpose in at least two ways. First, it allows us to refer addicts around the world to meetings in their area. Second, it links the group or trusted servant into the worldwide fellowship of Narcotics Anonymous. The WSO is the central information "clearinghouse" for the NA Fellowship. We can only perform this function if we have accurate contact information for our groups and members.

### WCNA TO OFFER SPECIAL DISCOUNT TRAVEL PACKAGES

WCNA-25 will be held 14 - 17 September 1995 at Disneyland-Paris (formerly EuroDisney), located just outside Paris, France. We are pleased to report that, in an effort to make this convention more affordable to our membership, we successfully negotiated special discount group travel packages from many North American cities. These packages include round-trip airfare on US Air or Air France, five days and four nights accommodation, based on double occupancy, at the convention headquarters hotel (the Hotel New York), round-trip shuttle transportation between the Paris airport and Disneyland Paris, and all taxes.

All travel at these discount rates must occur between 8 September and 22 September. Hotel accommodations for additional stays (before or after the convention) at the Hotel New York or any other hotel in Paris can be made at the time of booking. The discount packages are available on a first-come, first-serve basis. While no cutoff date has been set, we strongly suggest that you make your reservations before 15 April 1995 as we fully expect to sell out. All packages are based on availability.



## Travel Information

- The official currency in France is the Franc. As of January 1, 1995, one US Dollar was worth approximately five French Francs. We have used this figure to give you approximate prices in US Dollars. However, the currency exchange rate may change at any time. Current exchange rates are printed regularly in the business section of most daily newspapers.
- Paris is served by two airports: Roissy-Charles de Gaulle and Orly.
- A valid Passport is required for all non-European citizens entering France.
- Airport Shuttles leave from both airports every 45 min, for Disneyland Paris. Approximately FF75,00 (\$15.00US).
- Train (RER from Paris/Chatelet-Les Halles to Disneyland Paris): Line A4, direction Marne-La-Vallée. The trip takes approximately 40 min. and leaves every 16 min. The last train from Paris to Disneyland Paris is at Oh35 am (12:35am) and the last train from Disneyland Paris to Paris is at Oh22 am (12:22am). Approximately FF 37,00 (\$7,50US) one way. Three day travel Pass FF200,00 (\$40.00US).
- Taxi: From Paris to Disneyland Paris, approximately FF400,00 (\$80.00US).
- Rent A Car: For the best rates, contact travel or car rental agencies prior to departure.
- Parking is free for hotels residents and FF20.00 (\$4.00US) per day for visitors.
